“The Physical and Psychosocial Effects of Hearing and Balance Disorders in the Elderly: What you Should Know”

Speaker: Dr. Robert Keith, Ph.D: *Adjunct Professor and Director of Audiology Dept. of Communication Sciences and Disorders*

About the Seminar: Hearing loss is the third most prevalent chronic condition in older adults, and it is the number one communicative disorders of the aged. According to the National Council on Aging, untreated hearing loss has serious emotional and social consequences for older persons who can lead to isolation and depression. In addition, 50% of all falls suffered by the elderly are the result of vestibular problems and half of the elderly people who fall do so repeatedly. These simple facts indicate the tremendous need for individuals, professionals, care givers and all who are in contact with persons over 65 years of age be informed about hearing and balance disorders in the elderly. This seminar will cover both type and degree of hearing and balance disorders, current intervention strategies, and interventions to both prevent and treat resulting psychosocial and emotional disorders. **Course not offered for Counselor CEU's

“Emotional Intelligence”

About the Seminar: What is Emotional Intelligence? Emotional Intelligence (EI) refers to the ability to perceive, control, and evaluate emotions in yourself and others. It is the subset of social intelligence that involves the ability to monitor one's own and others' feelings and emotions, to discriminate among them, and to use this information to guide one's thinking and actions. The ability to acknowledge and adequately express emotions is a crucial skill to obtain. This training will help understand the function and purpose of emotions in human beings. By understanding the purpose of emotions, one can learn to identify, understand, and appropriately express themselves in a way that encourages healthy relationships. This training will include skills to identify feelings within yourself and in others, as well as skills that will appropriately express them.

“Understanding Substance Abuse and Helping Your Clients Cope”

Speaker: Emily Welling, MA; LPCC; CDCA: *founder of The Welling Group, LLC*

About the Seminar: This presentation will discuss substance abuse and how to identify, assess and treat those afflicted. It will cover the differences between alcohol abuse and dependence, the 10 warning signs of alcoholism and how decision making changes with different blood alcohol levels. The seminar will also cover the different classes of drugs. Different substance abuse assessments will be explained including the MAST (Michigan Alcoholism Assessment), the DAST (Drug Abuse Screening Test) and the CAGE assessment tools. The trainer will also go over various treatment modalities including the 12 steps of AA and symptoms of withdrawal. Family dynamics, co-dependency in the alcoholic family and triggers to substance abuse will be discussed. Lastly, coping skills will be discussed. Participants will leave this seminar with a better understanding of substance abuse and how to help.

“Understanding the Role of Assistance and Therapy Animals in Society”

About the Seminar: This seminar is designed for health care providers and others who are interested in increasing their awareness of assistance dogs as health care options for people with disabilities and the use of therapy dogs to enhance the lives of those who are institutionalized or in health care settings. The role and applications of assistance and therapy dogs will be discussed. The Americans with Disabilities Act will be defined with the latest updates outlined. Participants will learn how to identify persons appropriate for using an assistance animal and how a therapy animal may improve the quality of health or life of individuals in their facility. This program will include lecture, demonstration, printed resource information and a question and answer session.

“Motivational Interviewing: Introduction and Basic Skills: Part I”

Speaker: Greg Hogg, LISW-S; LCDC III: *Trainer, Talbert House*

About the Seminar: Motivational Interviewing (MI) is a collaborative, goal-oriented style of communication with particular attention to the language of change. It is designed to strengthen personal motivation for and commitment to a specific goal by eliciting and exploring the person's own reasons for change within an atmosphere of acceptance and compassion. The practice of motivational interviewing involves the skillful use of certain techniques and principles. This seminar will go over these techniques including OARS, which is a micro-counseling skills approach to MI. This seminar will go over the basics of MI and can be taken independently or taken with part II, which will be offered in July.
