About the Seminar: Conflict is a natural part of daily living. Minor conflict weaves into the fabric of life so as to go unnoticed. Major conflict, however, is much more noticeable and tends to complicate our lives and our relationships. Without skills in managing conflict, it overwhelms people and defies resolution. This workshop will provide opportunities for attendees to more completely understand the nature of conflict and its benefits. The learner will also more fully comprehend the powerful, negative components of conflict that can disrupt or destroy relationships, both personal and professional.

**“An Overview of Gottman’s Approach to Making Relationships Work”

About the Seminar: This seminar will provide an overview of John Gottman’s extensive knowledge of how to help couples with their connection. Using John Gottman’s well-known research in the relationship field, we will discuss how to understand what he has found as signs that often predict divorce in couples. As a result, he has developed guidelines for what successful couples do and how to apply this in working with couples to enhance their relationships, from learning to better communicate to deepening their overall connection. We will work through areas that Gottman suggests create disconnection, such as The Four Horsemen of the Apocalypse, as well as through his list of Seven Principles that Make Marriage Work, using examples, video clips and discussion to guide our learning.

With the ever increasing use of “fake” service dogs and emotional support animals in our community, we are seeing a negative impact on the use of legitimate assistance dogs. Participants will learn how to identify persons appropriate for using an assistance dog or emotional support animal and how a therapy animal may improve the quality of health or life of individuals.

**“Understanding How Ambivalence Effects Behavior Change”

About the Seminar: Change is usually something that people try to avoid, and yet it is a constant in life. Helping professionals are often tasked with assisting clients with behavior change. One of the main barriers to successful change is the normal human reaction to change, ambivalence or having mixed feelings about changing behavior. This interactive session is designed to introduce the concept of ambivalence as a normal reaction to change, and provide communication skills that are useful in working through ambivalence in a clinical setting so change can happen.
