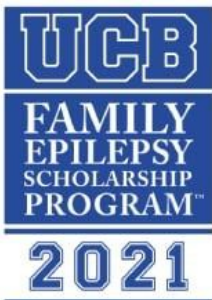

Taylor Huth Scholarship Fund

We are pleased to announce that Epilepsy Alliance Ohio will again be awarding the Taylor Huth Memorial Scholarship for individuals with epilepsy who are attending or will be attending college. Applications must be postmarked by **March 31, 2021**. A committee will review all applications and announce the winners in late March. This scholarship is given annually thanks to the generosity of the family and friends of Benjamin "Taylor" Huth who passed away after having a seizure. Our annual golf outing also supports this fund.



UCB will award 30 scholarships of up to \$5,000 and 3 scholarships of up to \$10,000 to people living with epilepsy, their family members, and caregivers pursuing higher education.

Thirty applicants who demonstrate academic and personal achievement will receive scholarships of up to \$5,000 each. Two applicants will receive Epilepsy Leader Scholarships of up to \$10,000 each honoring the late Sandra Helmers, MD, MPH and the late John M. Pellock, MD, two prominent figures in the epilepsy community who passed away in 2016. Additionally, UCB will award one applicant the Joe D'Souza Memorial Scholarship of up to \$10,000. This scholarship was created in 2019 in memory of UCB's Global Medical Director.

The recipients of the Epilepsy Leader Scholarships and the Joe D'Souza Memorial Scholarship will demonstrate academic and personal achievement and will also exemplify some of the qualities that Drs. Helmers and Pellock were best known for including a desire to advocate for and serve others, an interest in positively contributing to the epilepsy community and a persevering spirit.

Applications for the 2021 scholarship program are due Monday, **March 15, 2021**.

Remembering Linda Daffin

The epilepsy community in Ohio, lost a great friend and advocate in the fall of 2020, with the passing of Linda Daffin. Linda worked for over 20 years at OhioHealth as an EEG Tech and Neurodiagnostic Clinical Educator. She worked with countless people living with epilepsy and always treated them with the upmost care and respect. As one of her colleagues noted: "Linda was a wonderful human being and the matriarch of the epilepsy department... she knew the right way an EEG should be performed and could interpret EEG's with the best of them! She shared her knowledge with kindness and grace and treated everyone like family.

Linda died November 15th after a hard-fought battle with Covid. Our condolences go out to Linda's family and friends.

Linda was a regular attendee at our Living with Epilepsy Conference, and we are working with the epilepsy team at OhioHealth to present an annual award for EEG Techs who serve with excellence. Stay tuned for more details.
