"Exposure and Response Prevention Therapy for Obsessive Compulsive Disorder (OCD)" *Thursday, January 25, 2024*

Speaker: Lindsey Collins Conover, PhD, Linder Center of Hope

About the Seminar: Obsessive compulsive disorder is a common disorder that is often misunderstood by the public. Sufferers can experience significant life disturbance and functional impairment. Luckily, we have a psychotherapy that has, time and time again, shown to effectively reduce OCD symptoms and improve functioning - exposure and response prevention (ERP) therapy. This seminar will provide an overview of obsessive compulsive disorder and how it is diagnosed. We will discuss related disorders and how OCD is different than other anxiety disorders. We will then talk about ERP, the first line treatment for OCD. I will provide an overview on the behavioral model of OCD and how ERP works to break the cycle of obsessions and compulsions. Finally, we will discuss what ERP looks like in practice and review some examples of exposure hierarchies.

"Psychedelic Assisted Psychotherapy: An Overview" *Thursday, February 29, 2024*

Speaker: Linda Little, PsyD, Linder Center of Hope

About the Seminar: In this seminar, participants will learn about psychedelic assisted psychotherapy, including research on Psilocybin, Ketamine and MDMA. This seminar will review the research that shows how psychedelic medicines can treat mental illnesses such as Major Depression, End of Life anxiety and PTSD. We will review the variables that are important to consider when providing psychedelic assisted therapy, including set and setting. We will review the risks associated with these treatment as well as current legal status. Participants will also learn about MDMA (colloquially also known as "Ecstasy") and the research that shows how it can lead to a dramatic reduction, and in many participants, a complete remission of their symptoms.

"Dialectical Behavior Therapy (DBT) Skills Through Metaphors and Storytelling " *Thursday, March 28, 2024*

Speaker: James J Esmail, PsyD, Clinical Psychologist

About the Seminar: This training will examine the rational for using metaphors and storytelling to teach Dialectical Behavior Therapy (DBT) skills, plus practical tips for doing so effectively. Metaphors and storytelling will be used to provide an overview of the four DBT modules (Mindfulness, Emotion Regulation, Interpersonal Effectiveness) as well as the DBT concept of Radical Acceptance. In her seminal work introducing Dialectical Behavior Therapy, author Marsha Linehan points to the need to teach DBT through metaphors and stories. Comparing something that is abstract, complex, and difficult to understand to something more concrete and tangible has allowed humans to go beyond very simple cognition to understanding the more complex realities of life. DBT skills training continues to receive empirical support for both its original target population (self-harming individuals) but also broader applications (anxiety, depression, substance abuse, antisocial behavior and more, to enhance social and global functioning). The use of metaphors and storytelling to achieve positive therapy outcomes will be examined. Examples of these interventions to teach specific DBT skills will be presented.

"Anxiety and Depression in Older Adults" *Thursday, April 25, 2024*

Speaker: Kriss T. Haren, MA, MS, MINT Member, Registered Health Coach-III, collaborative Communication Consulting & Training Services Tipp City, Ohio

About the Seminar: According to the World Health Organization, by 2020, depression was predicted to be the leading cause of disability world-wide. Late life depression can be an overwhelming force for clients and for their care givers. Depression in older adults differs in many ways from depression in younger clients. It is **not** a normal part of the human aging process. Symptom presentation can be easily confused with other conditions that commonly affect primarily the geriatric patient. Clinicians and caregivers can miss warning signs and indicators that could lead to correct diagnosis, and thus to treatment. The same concept holds true for geriatric anxiety. It is often misdiagnosed and thus mistreated. The number and type of co-morbid medical conditions also complicates accurate diagnosis as well as symptom relief. This session will present key findings from current research to assist you in addressing this challenging situation.

"Practical Approaches to Solving Ethical Dilemmas" *Thursday, May 30, 2024* * Meets Ethics Requirements

"Creative Approaches In Practice: Helping The Client Get To Their Deep Feelings"

About the Seminar:

This course was created to equip practitioners with meaningful creative techniques that have served well in getting to the deeply held issues and feelings of clients more readily. The establishment of trust is still the first order of business after full disclosure about the process of therapy, informed consent, and pertinent data is collected. Once all of that is achieved and the client and therapist agree to the work, it is a question of helping the client get in touch with what is really bothering them. Talk therapy alone can take considerable time and the client may not have insight into the impact of past unresolved issues and trauma. Teaching clinicians how to safely approach the work is the goal of this course.
